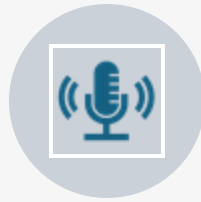

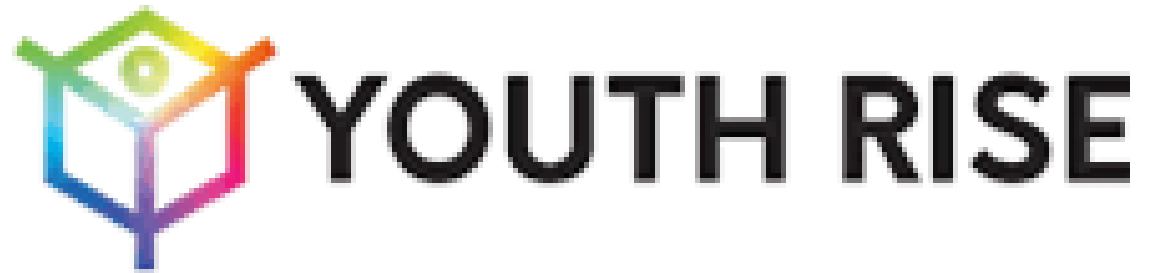


## Who are We?

---

**'Youth RISE'** and the **'Paradigma Coalition'** (Resources, Information, Support and Education) mobilizes youth to be engaged in full-spectrum harm reduction and drug policy reform to promote health and human rights.

Our work aims to amplify, maximise, and centre priorities of young people who use drugs and young people affected by drug policies and full-spectrum harm reduction at local, regional and international levels through coalition building, advocacy, and evidence gathering.





# Rights-Based Approaches to the Global Drug Response

Harm reduction recognized and **limitedly outlined by WHO and UNODC**

Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS: Ending Inequalities and Getting on Track to End AIDS by 2030

Human Rights Council resolution in 2023

Two recent Human Rights Reports on intersections of drug policy and human rights and the right to health

Statement of the 62 at CND: pro-reform coalition is composed of 62 countries and led by Colombia.



# Drug Reform Movement

However, ensuring harm reduction and drug policies are health and human rights based for young people remains an issue and controversial topic at the global drug policy level - focus is predominantly on preventing drug use in the first place instead of ensuring young people who already use drugs have access to youth friendly harm reduction services.

This is why we continue advocating for health and human rights based drug policies for young people. We do this at the UN level within [the Paradigma Coalition](#) and in our own capacities as the leading young people who use drugs led international organisation.



# Platforms that Support the HIV Response

UNAIDS, UNICEF, UNDP as part of the Global HIV Response partnering with Youth RISE to advance YPWUD led advocacy in various platforms

- Side events at decision making bodies like Commission on Narcotic Drugs, and Global Forum on Adolescents
- ayKP Partnership Toolkit and redevelopment into LEGACY
- Promotion of Youth RISE materials and resources

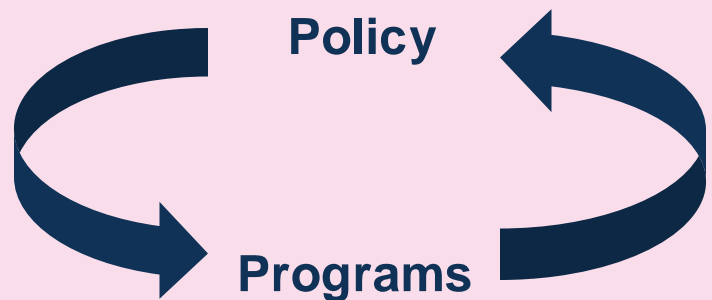

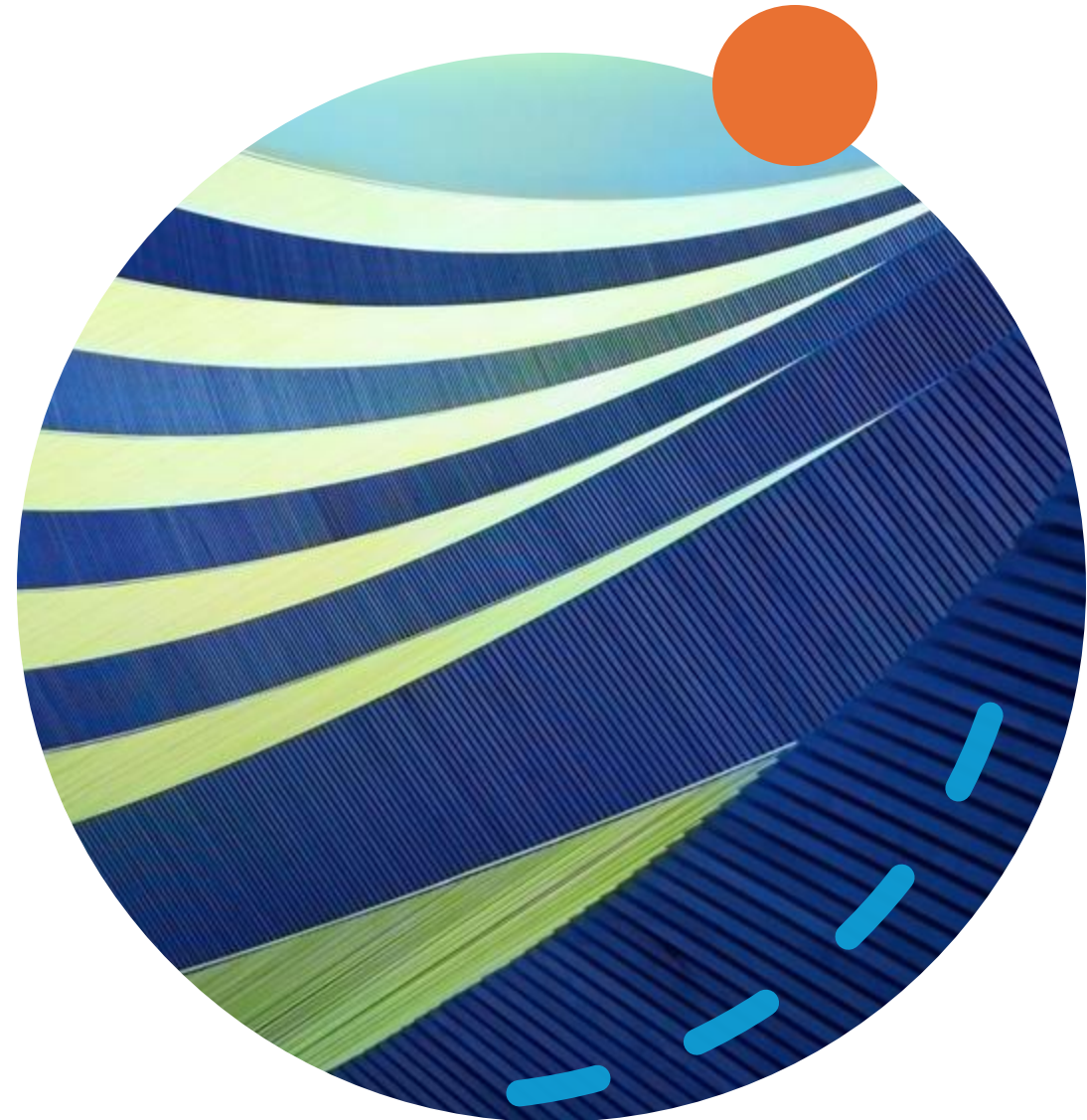
