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Reasons why engagement is mutually beneficial

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- Researchers test interventions that could be scaled
 - Appropriate staffing & level
 - Intervention in line with priorities and policies
- Scientific inference is appropriate
 - Especially important in absence of parallel control
 - Changing background and landscape
- Build enthusiasm and buy-in for scaling effective interventions



How can researchers go about engaging?

- Engage across the lifecycle of a project
 - Planning, implementation, post-results dissemination
- Engage with wide range of MOH
 - National, county, in-charges, front line health care workers
- Long term investments in partnerships
 - Building capacity with MOH to interpret, design, and collaborate on operations research and IS through long-term training programs
 - Fund attachments of scientists to MOH posts
